## Perkins, Somerset, Oldtown (PSO) Transformation

On January 20th, the *Baltimore Business Journal* named **PSO** one of the "Biggest Redevelopment to Look Out For". The article dotes about how the project is part of a **\$1 billion** redo of 244 acres in East Baltimore aimed at reshaping and upgrading some of Baltimore's long-ignored communities: Perkins Homes. Somerset and the Oldtown Mall.
